# SOUTH KOREA

Studying in Korea can be a rewarding experience. Here are some key things to know before you hop on that plane:

# **1. KOREAN LANGUAGE**

**Learn Basic Korean:** While many universities offer courses in English, basic Korean will be essential for everyday life, especially outside major cities.

# 2. CULTURAL ETIQUETTE

**Respect for Elders:** Korean culture places a strong emphasis on respect for elders. This includes using polite language and gestures.

**Bowing:** Bowing is a common greeting, especially in formal situations.

**Shoes Off Indoors:** It's customary to remove shoes when entering homes and some restaurants.



## 3. UNIVERSITY LIFE

**Teamwork:** Group projects are common, and Koreans tend to have a collaborative study style.

**Hierarchical Structure:** There's a noticeable respect for seniority in universities. Seniors (sunbaes) often mentor juniors (hoobaes).

**Campus Clubs:** Joining a student club can help you make friends and get involved in activities.

# 4. COST OF LIVING

**Living Expenses:** Major cities like Seoul can be expensive, especially for housing. Since HUFS offer a dormitory for students, you may want to check that out.

**Affordable Food:** Eating out is often affordable. Convenience stores and local restaurants provide inexpensive options.

## **5. TRANSPORTATION**

**Public Transportation:** Korea has an efficient public transportation system (subways, buses). Get a T-money card for easy access.

**Apps:** Use apps like KakaoMap and Naver Map for navigating, as Google Maps doesn't work well in Korea.

# 6. HEALTHCARE

**Health Insurance:** International students are required to have health insurance. Make sure you register for the National Health Insurance Service (NHIS) or a private alternative (if staying for one semester only).

**Pharmacies:** Pharmacies are common, but be aware that some medications may require a prescription.

# 7. PART-TIME JOBS (IF ALLOWED)

**Working in Korea:** International students can work part-time under specific visa conditions (usually up to 20 hours per week). Check with immigration for guidelines.

# 8. SOCIALIZING

**KakaoTalk:** This messaging app is widely used for communication. Having it installed is essential.

**Drinking Culture:** Drinking is common in Korea, especially during social gatherings. However, it's fine to decline politely if you don't drink.

# 9. FESTIVALS & EVENTS

**Experience Local Culture:** Korea has numerous festivals, from the Cherry Blossom Festival in spring to the Lantern Festival in fall. Participating in these can be a great way to immerse yourself in Korean culture.

# 2. HOST UNIVERSITY – HANKUK UNIVERSITY OF FOREIGN STUDIES (HUFS)

- **International Office:** The Office of International Affairs at HUFS offers support to international students. Familiarize yourself with their services for visa support, academic counseling, and housing assistance.

#### 8. Visa & Documentation

 Alien Registration Card (ARC): You will need to get an ARC within 90 days of arrival, as it's necessary for many things like opening a bank account and signing up for phone service. HUFS's international office can help guide you through the process.

#### 9. Mental and Physical Health

- Counseling Services: HUFS provides student counseling services, including for international students. If you feel overwhelmed, it's okay to reach out for support.
- Sports Facilities: HUFS offers sports facilities, which you can use for staying active and healthy during your studies.
